

# Counting Numbers in Korean



Two types of number writing systems.

-Sino-Korean: Use for things like counting money, math, measurements, the names of the months, and phone numbers. It's also used to talk about time in days, weeks, or years, but not the hour/time on the clock.

-Native Korean: Used to talk about the hour in time, age, and counting things and people.
